Help Wanted



Our great club needs some help. Volunteers are needed to fill the following posts:
eMail and Telephone Coordinator and helpers,
General Wagon Master (GWM),
Monthly Event Wagon Masters (MWM),
Elk Call Reporter.

Without these jobs, our club will not function anywhere near as well as it has done in the past. We may not expect the President to assume all of these responsibilities simply because no one has stepped up to help. Let me briefly outline the responsibilities of each.

The **e-Mail & telephone coordinator** simply when called upon, sends notices such as illness and distress by e-Mail to all those with e-Mail capability and telephones those without. This person can divide the telephone recipients among some helpers and need only make a few calls each. This may take from 10 minutes to a couple of hours a month.

The **General Wagon Master** plans and books the locations for the following year. The present year has already been set-up by the previous **GWM**. In addition the **GWM** obtains volunteer **MWMs** for the future events. This can be a lot of fun. Going to check out various new campgrounds. A mileage stipend is also allowed for these trips (see Article V, section 4).

The **Monthly Event Wagon Master** and **assistant MWM** plan and execute the outing. This includes: the meals that will be provided (if any), the games, tours or entertainment at the discretion of the **MWMs**, collecting the money, getting the information necessary for the members in the hands of the **newsletter editor** about 2 to 3 months in advance of the campout so he can make-up your newsletter flyer. It's easier for you than it seems

The **Elk Call Reporter** simply writes-up a description of the outing with details such as game winners, trips such as going to the Reagan Library or a train ride as a club. The reporter has two options: as soon as possible, after the outing is over he or she may send the story directly to **Jerry Margolin**, the **Elk Call editor** or send it to **Larry Hoffman**, the **Elk-Ender Newsletter editor**, and he will edit or rewrite it for you and pass it on to **Jerry**.

Please Note: *Article V section 3* of the bylaws states that "Each member is expected to serve as **Wagon Master** before anyone is required to serve a second time." This doesn't mean that members with longevity in the Elk-Enders needn't serve again. The older members should at least serve as Assistant MWMs (in my humble opinion) to teach and guide the newer member and to give them the confidence they need and deserve.

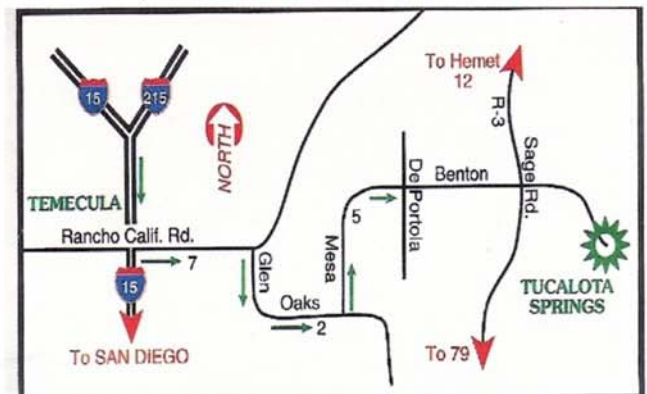

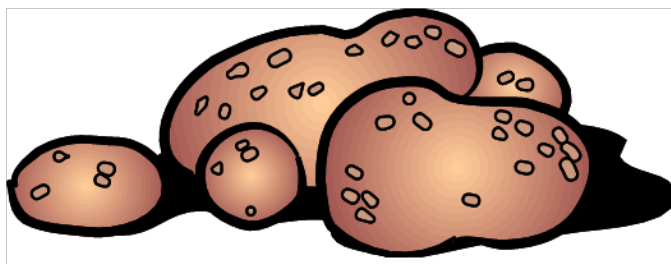

SCALLOPED POTATOES & CORN

Serves 8

Preheat oven to 350°F.

- 1 teaspoon plus ¼ cup butter
- 3 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 2 cups buttermilk
- 1½ teaspoons seasoned salt
- 1 teaspoon white pepper
- 8 medium potatoes, peeled and sliced 1/4 inch thick
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 1 cup frozen corn



Grease the bottom of a 9" x 13" baking dish with 1 teaspoon of the butter.

Place the remaining butter in a 4-cup glass measure. MICROWAVE on HIGH for 1 to 2 minutes, or until melted. Blend in flour until smooth and MICROWAVE on HIGH for 1 more minute; stirring twice. Add the buttermilk, salt and pepper; mixing well.

Combine the potatoes, onions and corn in the baking dish. Pour buttermilk mixture over the top. Sprinkle additional seasoned salt and pepper over the top for color.

Bake at 350°F until golden brown and bubbly, about 1 hour. Serve hot.

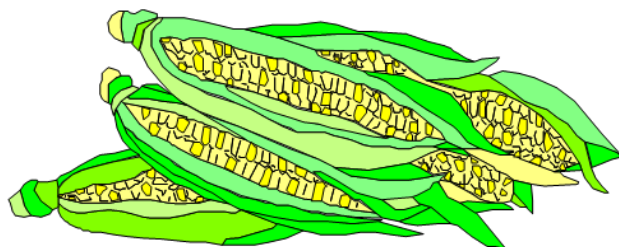
- 30 OZ. package Ore-Ida Shredded Hash Browns

- 1 Cup Grated Cheddar Cheese
- 1 Cup Sour Cream
- 1/2 Cube of Butter or Margarine Melted
- 1 Cup Corn Flakes
- 9X13 Pan Glass or Foil

Combine

Potato, Soup, Cheese & Sour Cream in Pan

If too dry add a little milk

Top with Corn Flakes drizzle with melted butter



Bake 350 Degrees for 30 to 40 Minutes (Light Brownd Corn Flakes)
